### Our Mission

*We are disciples of Christ making the love of God known through our witness and service in all we think, say and do*

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this fourth Sunday of Easter, I invite our Diocese to focus on the subject of our vocation. Some years ago, on a Vocation Sunday I missed a member from church. When I enquired why she was absent from church she replied, "I thought we were on vacation." It reminded me that we must not take for granted that we all know what is being said by words which are not a regular part of our religious vocabulary.

The word vocation is derived from the Latin *vocare* which means 'to call.' As a noun it refers to an occupation, to a person's job, profession, career. In a religious sense it refers to a divine call on a person's life. This is not limited to vocations within the church. Those in the medical and teaching professions once spoke of their work as a vocation, meaning they were responding to and fulfilling their God given purpose.

In looking at the subject of vocation, we are asking ourselves, what is our God given purpose. The call of God is not unique to the ordained. All Christians are called by God. The summons to the sacred ministry, or to other ministries within or without the church are calls which arise out of our call to discipleship. We need people who will live out their vocation as Christians in their regular jobs.

Christian discipleship is a call to service. Jesus said to the first disciples, "follow me and I will make you fish for people." Our baptism is a call to ministry. There are various ministries within the church, or there maybe a new area of ministry, to which God is calling you. If you are not certain how or where you can serve, have a discussion with your priest or a member of the congregation.

I invite congregations to create opportunities for discussions on the subject of vocations. To provide mentorship, where possible, or direction to those wrestling with making decisions about their lives.

It is my prayer that we will spend some time reflecting on God's call on our lives, and support one another in responding faithfully.

Let us pray and encourage full-time vocations. I invite us to pray for vocations, using the Diocesan Prayer for Vocations.
